

NAME: TANISHA STANTON **AGE:** 15 **HOMETOWN:** NEWCASTLE

From Newcastle on the New South Wales North Coast – Tanisha Stanton is the true definition of all rounder. After excelling in hockey and then athletics, at just 15 years of age, Tanisha has already played at the state and national level in both Netball and Touch Football, and has just been named in the U18 Australian women's touch football team, oh, and did we mention she's already won a Deadly award?

Congratulations on your 2011 Deadly Award Tanisha for Most Promising New Talent in Sport – how were you feeling when your name was ready out?

Tanisha Stanton: It was just so unexpected, but it was a great feeling, and such an honour. It makes me very proud. I'm very proud of what I've achieved so far, it's been a lot of hard work and effort, but it's been worth it.

At the moment you're excelling in two sports,

netball and touch football, do you have a preference for one over the other?

It's pretty neck and neck, I love them both and I enjoy going to both of them but sometimes when I'm at one I kind of get over it so it's good that I can just bounce back to the other one, it's kind of hard to choose between both.

How do you manage to find time for all your sports and your schoolwork?

It keeps me extremely busy, we're always on the go and my parents take my everywhere, but my sister gets her P's next month so my parents will probably make her start driving me! It is a challenge with school but I try to work around that and it's going pretty good at the moment. I like PE and I like Australian as well, I go pretty good at that, and I'm looking at nutrition and dieting and stuff like that for down the track - uni sounds good.

Who are some of your heroes in sport?

Definitely Bo dela Cruz who I've met. One of my friends went to an Aboriginal tournament with her in New Zealand with an Indigenous team, and I'm hoping to play with that team, playing alongside Bo would be great, and Cathy Freeman is another big hero of mine, from touch footy, Emily Hopkins who plays in the Australian team is another, and Dylan Hennessey who used to play for Australia as well, I'm good friends with them.

MY MOB IS: Noongar tribe and Minang and Goreng clans from down south in WA.

I LIVE ON: Whadjuk boodja (land) in Perth, Noongar country, but come from Gnowangerup.

THE POPULATION HERE IS:

Perth... no idea, sorry, never concern myself with the figure, just know we are a beautiful small city with country pace. The population of Gnowangerup is approx 1400.

BRIEF HISTORY: The name Gnowangerup comes from the Aboriginal word 'Ngow', meaning Malleefowl. For thousands of years the area was a hunting ground for the Goreng Noongars – and stone implements are still found along the creeks that we played in as children. Gnowangerup is a small wheatbelt farming town, which many of my family worked on, and also around the surrounding areas of Ongerup, Borden and Jerramungup.

DESCRIPTION: The Shire of Gnowangerup is located in the Great Southern area, approximately 354km from Perth and 140km from Albany. Driving through the main street you would think there was nothing to Gnowangerup because it is so small – one main street, one


