# hopdreams



ast month, basketball prodigy Patrick Mills took another step closer to his dream when he was included in the Australian men's basketball team training camp – the first of three in the lead up to the International Basketball Federation World Championships.

The Boomers' 22 man squad attended a training camp held at the Australian Institute of Sport. The camp gave Patrick the opportunity to rub shoulders with the nation's top basketballers, including National Basketball Association (NBA) star Andrew Bogut, and was just the latest in a series of extraordinary achievements for this talented young Indigenous player.

Earlier this year, Patrick was part of the World Select team which took on the USA at the Nike Hoop Summit in Memphis. The Summit is considered the premier world basketball contest, featuring leading players from around the world aged 19 and under.

## Teenage basketball sensation Patrick Mills is all set to take on the world.

The World Select team was made up of players from countries such as Greece, Russia, Spain, Brazil, China, Belgium, Senegal and Nigeria. Patrick was proud to be the lone Australia representative in the side. The US team featured top high school players. Playing in his first Summit match, Patrick score eight points, grabbed two rounds and led the side with eight assists.

Selection in the World Select and the Boomers training squad have been just rewards for Patrick's rapid rise through the basketball ranks. In 2003 he won a scholarship to the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), and since then his game has risen to new heights.

Late last year, Patrick was a part of the AIS men's team which toured the US, playing nine college teams across California. In Game One against Fullerton College, Patrick was the top scorer for Australia, scoring 20 points.

Born in Canberra, 17-yearold Patrick comes from a basketball-mad family. His cousin is former basketball star, Danny Morseu.

Marty Clarke has coached Patrick for the last two years at the AIS, and during that time he's watched Patrick develop into what he believes to be the number one basketball prospect in the country. "When he first arrived at the AIS, Patrick was a player who needed to score a lot of points in every game," Marty says.

"Now he has a greater understanding of the responsibilities of the point guard role, organising and leading the team and getting people the ball.

"At the junior level, players can get away with being really good in just one area, but as they progress they need to develop a more rounded game, and Patrick has done that. His containment on defence, his ball handling and his perimeter game has certainly improved as well as his ability to shoot off the dribble."

Off the court, Patrick has also impressed his coach, who has plenty of faith that Patrick will go on to achieve great things.

"He is an extremely coachable," he says. "He listens and he's open to suggestions. He's the kind of person people like to be around. He's very charismatic and tries just as hard in the classroom as he does on court."

Patrick now has his sights set on earning a place in the Australian team for the World Championships. And despite only being a teenager, his dreams are closer to becoming a reality than ever before.
