Leading the way

The AFL steps in to help create more jobs for Indigenous people looking for jobs in sport.

he second annual Dreamtime at the G was held at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in May of this year. Dreamtime at the G is an important event that recognises and celebrates the role that Indigenous players have had and continue to have on the game of AFL. The match played between rival clubs Richmond and Essendon is also a great way to demonstrate how Aussie Rules can build bridges between cultures in the spirit of reconciliation.

The concept is the brainchild of Essendon coach Kevin Sheedy, and is supported by the AFL and the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations (DEWR). Through their sponsorship, DEWR is looking to raise awareness of the practical assistance available under the Indigenous Employment Programme, which aims to increase levels of Indigenous employment, self-employment and business development.

To honour their commitment to Indigenous employment, the AFL announced that they would become signatory to DEWR's Corporate Leaders for Indigenous Employment Programme at this year's Dreamtime at the G. Corporate Leaders work together to help create more job opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. AFL CEO Andrew Demetrious signed a Memorandum of Understanding to become a Corporate Leader on September 1 this year.

The signing of the agreement affirms the AFL's commitment to develop strategies to improve the prospects of Indigenous Australians seeking higher skilled and management positions within its workforce.

Dreamtime at the G will undoubtedly develop into a great football tradition. It gives us all the opportunity to take the time to reflect on the many and varied achievements that Indigenous people have brought to the competition.



here are more Indigenous players starring in the AFL than in any other sport, with this highly demanding game being ideally suited to the natural athletic abilities of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. The AFL recognises this, and has created programmes and initiatives to help more talented young Indigenous players make their way into the AFL.

Current AFL initiatives for Indigenous people include the Qantas AFL Kickstart Camp, which is an event run by Qantas with the support from the AFL to offer young elite Indigenous players from around Australia a unique football and educational experience with the possibility of future career opportunities.

But you don't have to be a player to be a part of the AFL. Qantas AFL Kickstart also facilitates career opportunities in the AFL, and offers courses in coaching, umpiring and club administration.

DREAMTIME AT THE G - GAINING MOMENTUM IN 2006

The match was preceded by performances from some of Australia's finest entertainers such as Paul Kelly and Peter Garrett to help recognise the Aboriginal influence in AFL football, with prominent indigenous sportsmen Michael Long and Cathy Freeman also on hand in a cavalcade of Australian legends.

In the lead-up to the match Michael Long led The Long Walk participants in a symbolic walk across William Barak Bridge to the MCG.

Just prior to the start of the game, respected Wurundjeri elder Joy Murphy conducted a short Welcome to Country ceremony with the captains of both sides to welcome the Clubs to the traditional lands of the Wurundjeri people.
