## **Comma**

Commas are used to separate words, phrases or clauses within the sentence. These added words may add extra information but they don't change the meaning of the sentence.

## **DIRECT SPEECH MARKS**

Direct speech marks tell us what is said. They show the actual words of a speaker.

## **INDIRECT SPEECH**

Indirect speech is reported speech, and no quotation marks are needed.

### **Example**

I said that I would punctuate the sentences. (INDIRECT)

"I am going to punctuate the sentences," I said. (DIRECT)

"They wanted an Indigenous perspective on history," Darren said.

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"I think the true stories that Aboriginal people have to tell are amazing," he says.

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"It was hard – sometimes horrific," she said.
